<b>1</b>	<b>Health &amp; Safety</b> <i>All ACL employees, subs/suppliers to follow Covid-19 handbook. ## **Emergency Service**

Please be advised that there is no through traffic East and West bound on Dunlop Street between Toronto St. to Owen St. Hoarding fencing has been placed west of Owen St. and Dunlop St. intersection to stop pedestrian and vehicle traffic within the job site.
